Bible Name Dictionary

Bible Name: Almon Diblathaim Language: Hebrew Pronunciation: al-mone' dib-law-thaw'-yem-aw

Meaning: The name 'Almon Diblathaim' means 'Concealing the Fig Cakes.' It is derived from two Hebrew root words. The first is 'Alam' meaning 'to veil', 'to conceal', 'to cover', 'to hide', 'to be kept out of sight' or 'to be secretive.' The second root word is 'Debelah' meaning a 'lump of pressed figs' or a 'cake of pressed figs.' The Israelite encampment of 'Almon Diblathaim' was situated between Dibon-Gad and the mountains of Abarim in the territory belonging to Sihon.

Please note: The word 'Diblathaim' is plural in nature (due to the Hebrew suffix 'im').
