Bible Name Dictionary

Bible Name: Baale Language: Hebrew Pronunciation: bah-al-ay'

Meaning: The name 'Baale' means 'Masters.' It is derived from the Hebrew root word 'Baal' meaning 'to marry', 'to possess', 'to own', 'to rule over' or 'to have dominion' (in the feminine sense).

*** 'Baale' is closely associated with the word 'Baalah.' ***

Alternative meanings include: 'Female Owners' or 'Female Mistresses.'

*** The name 'Baale' is plural in this particular instance. ***

Please note: The word 'Baal' generally has reference to the following descriptive meanings: 'husband', 'lord', 'master' or 'owner.' It was also used by the Canaanites as a substitute title for their god, Hadad.

*** Please see 'Baal' for additional information ***

On another note... the name 'Baale' is never used to signify a female goddess. It can on occasion refer to the Canaanite god 'Baal' (in the feminine sense) when referring to certain city names.

*** Hence... the name 'Baale' could actually mean: 'The City of Baal.' ***
(This is highly probable!)

More on the word 'Baale'... it generally denotes the owner of something (such as a home). It can also apply to someone (in this case a woman) possessing certain skills of mastery (i.e., a master of charms).

*** This is generally the case when the name is applied to a person rather than a city (or place). ***

Please note: 'Baale' is synonymous with the name 'Baale of Judah.'

*** 'Baal of Judah' most likely served as the seat of Baal worship in the land of Judah. ***
